**Pastor's Reflection**

This week at all of our Masses there are Respect Life events and prayers at our parish, a rally at the Statehouse, a Mass for the Protection of Unborn Children at St. Joseph's Cathedral and of course the March for Life in Washington D.C. next weekend. We wish that the practice of abortion would end immediately, but there is no doubt that these concerted efforts over these many years have certainly helped to lower the rates of abortion and of this we can be certain. Today we continue our prayers with the fervent hope that they will continue to be heard and that we ourselves may continue to be living witnesses of the sacredness of life in every aspect of our lives.

Each week we are settling in a little more into our new church and Eucharistic chapel. While I am more than pleased with all that has been completed, with the project that has been this large, I am sure that you are aware that we have a "punch list" of quite a few items that we are attending to on a daily basis. That list is in fact several pages. And so if there is something that you see that you think needs attention, you can certainly let us know in the office, but there is probably a good possibility that we are aware of it. Some of the items we are not going to be able to get to for at least six months. I had a conversation with Fr. Charlie Klinger, the pastor of St. Paul's in Westerville, whose church was completed six years ago and he told me they were still working on their "punch list"!

**RESPECT LIFE**

Did you know that abortion through all 9 months of pregnancy has been legal in our country for the last 44 years? January 22 marks the date of the famous court decision, Roe vs. Wade which legalized abortion in all 50 states. There are some opportunities this month to pray that this horrific decision be reversed and Human Life once again be recognized as the special gift from God that it is.

\*\*Please pray for Respect for all Human Life with Bishop Fredrick Campbell at Mass at 10:30 AM on Monday, January 23 at St. Joseph's Cathedral, 212 E. Broad St. This year's observance is titled a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children.

\*\*Please attend the Roe Remembrance event at the Ohio Statehouse on Monday, January 23, at 12 noon. This year the program, sponsored by Greater Columbus Right to Life, will be inside in the Statehouse Atrium. This is immediately after the Mass at the Cathedral. This is a visible way to make our lawmakers and downtown workers understand our Life affirming beliefs.

\*\*Please remember the words of Saint Mother Theresa: "Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love but to use violence to get what they want. This is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion."

**175. In what does the mission of the Apostles consist?**

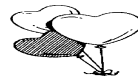
