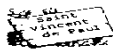

#### *Susan Kolb recommends ...*

"Secret Diaries of the Holocaust: The Untold Story of Nonna Bannister" by Nonna Bannister

Using her decades old diaries that had been hidden away most of her life, Nonna Bannister writes this book not long before her death in Tennessee. She and her family were wealthy Russian landowners before the German invasion of WWII. She tells of the horrors, fears, pain, and ultimate love and forgiveness of her life. A really good book. You can tell Nonna has written it herself which adds to the realness and feeling of the experiences. You'll come away with a great sense of respect for this woman and others who lived through the horrendous experience of WWII.

#### *Debbie Clegg recommends ...*

"Nine Words" by Allen Hunt

Published by Dynamic Catholic, this short study focuses on the Fruit of the Holy Spirit as listed by Paul in Galatians. Each Fruit is a behavior that builds and enhances our holiness. The book is very readable and a good review of each Fruit. Further, Hunt presents clear suggestions about how to practice them. These days, it is more and more important to work on positives and teach them by example and reinforcement in our families.

#### *Christina Brown recommends ...*

"The Shack" by William P. Young.

This was one book that kept my interest and had me invested in the characters and storyline. The main character, "Mack", is struggling with his faith, due to a tragic event in his life that causes a deep depression. One day, Mack receives a mysterious invitation in the mail to spend a weekend away at the shack, which supernaturally transforms into a place that could only be described as heaven. There, he meets the author's interesting take on the Holy Trinity, and spends the weekend learning about our life on earth.
