### PASTOR'S REFLECTION

Lent begins this week on Ash Wednesday. It is a time of many graces for our lives and the larger Church. It is a time of conversion for all of us. It is a time for everyone to turn back to God. There is something in all of us that needs a good Lent. Deep inside, we all know that we are not going to live forever. As we hear on Ash Wednesday: *Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return.* So very simply, Lent is a good time to reassess the direction of our lives and to make any course directions that we deem necessary. The precepts of Lent are simple: prayer, fasting and giving alms. To assist you with your prayer, I encourage to pick up one of the Little Black Books or Resisting Happiness by Matthew Kelly that we are making available for your spiritual reading. Take time for prayer in our new Eucharistic Chapel, or the church that is always open every day. Once again we are participating in "Operation Rice Bowl" with proceeds going toward Catholic Relief Services. I know that this is going to be the Best Lent Ever in your life if you take the first steps that I have outlined above.
