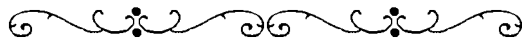

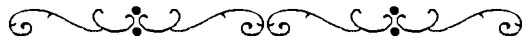

During the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent we will be celebrating the Scrutinies with our Elect (those that are unbaptized, previously called catechumen) at one of the masses. The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect. And, to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. These rites deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.

All of the faithful in the assembly will derive benefit from experiencing the Scrutinies, and joining in the intercessions for the elect.

4th Sunday of Lent

"Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart." 1Samuel 16:7
