DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

3:00pm April 23rd Seton Parish

On Divine Mercy Sunday, Parishes throughout the country are encouraged to join together in prayer and adoration seeking God's mercy for ourselves and for our nation. Come join other Seton parishioners at 3pm this Sunday for a Eucharistic Holy hour for Divine Mercy. There will be Adoration, music, prayer, reflection, and reciting the Divine Mercy Chaplet. (Prayer cards and programs will be available).

Divine Mercy Sunday is rooted in the writings of a poor Polish nun, St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938), and her revelations about God's mercy. Her message is that god is merciful and loving and so must we be to others. Today is a national feast in Poland and is celebrated in the Vatican. Soon after St. Faustina was canonized in 2000, Pope John Paul II decreed that today be "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come." Since today's readings touch on the sacrament of penance, it is a natural day to celebrate this devotion.
