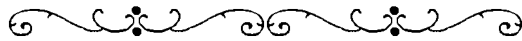

Pastor's Reflection

This weekend our children are receiving their 1st Holy Communion. It is always one of the most joyful celebrations of the year as our children have been yearning for this day for a long time. Throughout this Easter season, we read from the gospel of St. John in what is called the *Bread of Life Discourse* and here Jesus says, "I am the bread of life, he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in me shall never thirst." Our children are living examples this day of those who truly hunger for this Bread of Life that Jesus gives to us. This is the only true bread that can satisfy the hunger of our lives. The children today receive for the first-time manna from heaven that will sustain them for the long journey of their lives to heaven. What a wondrous gift to be able to receive from the table of the Lord and to be united to Jesus Christ and to be partakers in the very divine life of God. Do you still hunger for God and this food which produces everlasting life? Catechism Corner

May 7, 2017 – Fourth Sunday of Easter

252. What names are given to the first sacrament of initiation?

This sacrament is primarily called *Baptism* because of the central rite with which it is celebrated. To baptize means to “immerse” in water. The one who is baptized is immersed into the death of Christ and rises with him as a “new creature” (2 *Corinthians* 5:17). This sacrament is also called the “bath of regeneration and renewal in the Holy Spirit” (2 *Timothy* 2:19); and it is called “enlightenment” because the baptized becomes “a son of light” (2 *Corinthians* 4:6).

255. Starting when and to whom has the Church administered Baptism?

From the day of Pentecost, the Church has administered Baptism to anyone who believes in Jesus Christ.
