Pastor's Reflection

Today we celebrate Mother's Day, a day on which we honor our mothers, living and deceased for their care, concern, and unconditional love they have shown us throughout the years of our lives. It is one of those special days that we cherish and look forward to each year. Few people know that this day was originally conceived by a mother during the civil war with a call for peace and unity for women against war. Julia Ward wrote in 1870 a Proclamation for Peace, but it failed to get recognition. In 1914, President Wilson declared the first national Mother's Day. So, in our remembrance of Mother's Day this year, let us not forget the origins of this day and its call for peace as our planet is plagued with war. As Pope Frances said, this past week, "I was ashamed by the use of the name, 'Mother of all bombs.' Look, a Mother gives life, this brings death, and this is what we casually call it. What on earth is happening here? God created the world and placed man and woman at the center..." May all of our mothers be instruments of God's peace in our world this day.

One of the gifts of our parish community that we recognize on this Mother's Day is the gift of new life that our parish is blessed with. We are so pleased with the many children of all ages that fill our church. Many of these children are infants and still need to come to church in carriers of one sort or another and often sleep in them through part of Mass. And that is certainly acceptable. We have noticed though that these car seats are beginning to leave scratches on our new pews. A generous parishioner has designed some quilted pads to place under your carriers to prevent further damage to our pews. We simply want to continue to keep our church as beautiful as it is now as your children grow into young adults, for they are the future of our Church that we are handing it onto. The ushers will have these pads when you enter the church, and you can return them to the ushers as you leave. Thank you for making use of them.

I would like to thank all those who have pledged to the Bishop's Annual Appeal. There are still envelopes in the pews or in the narthex in which you can make your gift. The needs of our diocese are great. We hope to realize our parish goal of 100% participation. Our parish goal is \$180,000. Remember that every dollar raised over that goal is returned to our parish. In the first week of our campaign, we received 211 gifts for a total amount of \$58,416 toward our goal. With everyone's participation, now you can see how easily we can go over our goal, and have the significant funds returned to our parish for the refurbishment of our restrooms.
