It is hard to believe that we have already arrived at the end of the school year. This morning at the 9:30 Mass we have our annual Senior Recognition Mass. It is an opportunity to ask God's blessings to come down upon all our graduates and to thank God for all the blessings he has given to them over the years. In the weeks and days ahead, our graduates will be receiving their diplomas and many awards and they will be honored for all of their achievements. How important it is, though, to honor the source of all these blessings as we do in in the Eucharist. Always at this Mass, we also honor one of our graduating Seniors with the Judith Jones Scholarship which is based on upon scholarship, citizenship in the community, and service in the parish community. As our students take their next step, they go with our prayers and blessings. May they continue to nurture all the gifts that God has given to them We pray that they will not forget the foundation that have received here at Seton Parish and that they will always consider this to be their spiritual home.
