Pastor's Reflection

As we complete the end of the school year there are always several awards that are handed out for many different achievements. I would like to highlight a couple of them here. Last week at the Senior Recognition Mass, the parish awarded the Judith Jones Scholarship which is a \$1,000 scholarship to a Senior in the parish who has demonstrated outstanding service in the parish, community and scholastic achievement. Judith Jones served our parish in the Department of Religious Education when the parish first started and she died in 1999. Her family began this scholarship in her name. This year's scholarship goes to Jacob Thompson who is graduating from Bishop Hartley High School.

Each year Bishop Campbell also awards the Serra Club Award to two outstanding 8th grade servers who have been faithful to the ministry of serving through their years of schooling. This year's awards go to Elizabeth Kitsmiller and Anna Woods. Both of them are graduating from St. Pius school.

Finally, I wish to acknowledge the completion of the Eagle Scout Project by Joseph Johnson. He, with the assistance of his fellow scouts, have completed a beautiful designed rock garden around the Sacred Heart Statue out in front of the Parish Activity Center. This completes the transition from its old home in front of the church to its current location. My goal is that throughout our parish campus we have visible signs of our Catholic faith and heritage. We are blessed with such beautiful grounds and of course this is something that can continue to grow well into the future.

I would like to thank all those who have pledged to the Bishop's Annual Appeal. There are still envelopes in the pews or in the narthex in which you can make your gift. The needs of our diocese are great. We hope to realize our parish goal of 100% participation. Our parish goal is \$180,000. Remember that every dollar raised over that goal is returned to our parish. In the first three weeks of our campaign, we received 365 gifts for a total amount of \$98,284 toward our goal. We are over the halfway point of our goal with approximately 15% participation of the participating families pledging. Imagine now if everyone contributed, how easily we would go over our goal, and have the significant funds returned to our parish for the refurbishment of our restrooms. Thank you for your generosity.
