I would like to announce to the parish an important staffing change. John Bernard is no longer our business manager/bookkeeper. Jim was an invaluable person during the renovation of our church and was an active member of our construction team. Since the dedication of our church, Jim has actively managed the completion of the "punch list." Recently Jim attended the Amazing Church Conference along with several members of our parish staff and he has been a valuable resource in building a parish leadership team following the Amazing Church Conference serving in an advisory capacity to me as the pastor in all matters of the parish operation. In addition to his skills in music, Jim has a degree in business from Otterbein University. He is fitting in very well in this position while still learning many of its finer details of this new position. Please join me in welcoming Jim to his new position.

I would like to thank all those who have pledged to the Bishop's Annual Appeal. There are still envelopes in the pews or in the narthex in which you can make your gift. The needs of our diocese are great. We hope to realize our parish goal of 100% participation. Our parish goal is \$180,000. Remember that every dollar raised over that goal is returned to our parish. In the first four weeks of our campaign, we received 387 gifts for a total amount of \$103,661 toward our goal. We are over the halfway point of our goal with approximately 15% participation of the participating families pledging. Imagine now if everyone contributed, how easily we would go over our goal, and have the significant funds returned to our parish for the refurbishment of our restrooms. Thank you for your generosity.

144. What happened at Pentecost?

Fifty days after the Resurrection at Pentecost the glorified Jesus Christ poured out the Spirit in abundance and revealed him as a divine Person so that the Holy Trinity was fully manifest. The mission of Christ and of the Spirit became the mission of the Church which is sent to proclaim and spread the mystery of the communion of the Holy Trinity.

"We have seen the true Light, we have received the heavenly Spirit, we have found the true faith: we adore the indivisible Trinity, who has saved us." (Byzantine Liturgy, Troparion of Vespers of Pentecost).
