This weekend I am pleased to announce, Friar Colin King, the son of Tunney and Norah King is being ordained a Franciscan priest for the Province of St. John the Baptist this Saturday, June 10th at 10:00 a.m. by Bishop Joseph R. Binzer, the Auxiliary Bishop of Cincinnati. Fr. Colin has assisted here at Seton parish for the last several years at Christmas and Easter when he was home to assist at our liturgical celebrations. Fr. Colin completed his theological studies in Chicago and has had the opportunities in his formation to serve in such missionary territories as Haiti. His first assignment as a priest is going to be taking him to Jamaica. Before Fr. Colin begins his new assignment, he will be returning here to Seton Parish for a Mass of Thanksgiving on Sunday, July 9th at the 11:15 Mass and there will be a reception for him following that Mass. This is a great honor for yet another vocation to the priesthood from Seton Parish. It is with great joy that both Deacon Hector and myself are travelling to Cincinnati to be a part of his ordination celebration that will take place at St. Clement Church in Cincinnati.

I would like to thank all those who have pledged to the Bishop's Annual Appeal. There are still envelopes in the pews or in the narthex in which you can make your gift. The needs of our diocese are great. We hope to realize our parish goal of 100% participation. Our parish goal is \$180,000. Remember that every dollar raised over that goal is returned to our parish. In the first five weeks of our campaign, we received 408 gifts for a total amount of \$108,662 toward our goal. We are over the halfway point of our goal with approximately 16.25% participation of our member families pledging. Imagine now if everyone contributed, how easily we would go over our goal, and have the significant funds returned to our parish for the refurbishment of our restrooms. Thank you for your generosity.

42. In what way does God reveal that he is love?

Seton Parish Youth is a comprehensive youth ministry program based on Renewing the Vision: A Framework for Catholic Youth Ministry open to **ALL STUDENTS** in grades 7-12, regardless of what school they attend, including those who are home schooled. Seton Parish Youth is more than Sunday night PSR, we have a host of other events and activities for students of the parish in grades 7 – 12 (Rising 6th graders are welcome to attend all our summer activities and join LT).

2017/2018 SPY Leadership Team: Applications are available. SPY LT is open to all students in grades 7 – 12 who attend Seton Parish. Applications and LT Retreat Permission forms are due by July 9, 2017

We provide leadership development through our Leadership Team, which is open to all students in the parish who are interested in being on the core team and be the voice of the youth in the parish, committed to living out the Gospel message. Our leadership ministry activates all the resources of our faith community in a comprehensive integrated approach that is intentional. Our team is a privilege, responsibility and commitment, to one another and to the community. The ministry of leadership development calls forth, affirms and empowers the diverse gifts of each young person in our community, and each student must be trained and encouraged to reach their fullest potential. The student team facilitates the activities and ministries offered through our youth program in the planning, coordinating, and executing of events to draw others into a closer relationship with Christ and community. Students must continually develop their own faith formation, especially after Confirmation either through Religious Education on Sunday evenings or in Catholic School (and a few do both).

What is Leadership Team? The Leadership Team is open to ALL STUDENTS in grades 7 -12. The core leadership of SPY is comprised of approximately 10 adults and 35 student team members ranging from grades 7 – 12; the student team is the voice of the youth committed to living out the Gospel Message. The Students work together with adult advisers in planning events and activities for all Seton Parish Youth. The Goals for Ministry with Adolescents as set forth by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops are as follows:

To empower young people to live as disciples of Jesus Christ in our world today.

To draw young people to responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the Catholic faith community.

To foster the total personal and spiritual growth of each young person.
