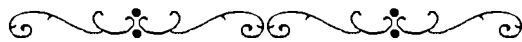

Pastor's Reflection

It is hard to believe that it is already six months since we have been in our newly renovated church. During these months, there has hardly been a week that has gone by that there has not been some work done to complete this large project. Some of this has included the completion of the painting of the front entrances of the new chapel and the new front entrance of the church; all the beautiful landscaping; the completion of closets, the completion of the lighting in Herrmann Hall as well as many other details. There is still more to be done that you will be seeing in the weeks to come. During construction, there was some damage to some of the concrete of our entrances from heavy equipment as well as deterioration of concrete due to simply aging. All of that is going to be repaired starting this Monday morning and entry into the Church under the portico might be limited. During this time, you will have to enter from the 256 entrance. This work will be completed in one week. Then beginning on Monday July 3rd, we are going to be doing some major work in the chapel. The chapel is going to be closed for three weeks. There were portions of the Jerusalem Stone that were not cut properly that must be taken up and replaced. In addition, the flooring beneath the carpeting needs redone, and that is the reason why that portion of the floor creaks so badly now. It was all done in a hurry and as the saying goes "haste makes waste." Finally, there are exposed seams in the pillars that need to be finished and repainted. This is under warranty, and the only part of the work that we are picking up the tab for is the concrete work for the slabs of concrete that are being replaced because of age. Once this work is completed, this finishes the bulk of the work on the renovation project. Thank you for your patience.

THE FIRST COMMANDMENT: I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD, YOU SHALL NOT HAVE OTHER GODS BEFORE ME

442. What is implied in the affirmation of God: "I am the Lord your God" (Exodus 20:2)?

This means that the faithful must guard and activate the three theological virtues and must avoid sins which are opposed to them. Faith believes in God and rejects everything that is opposed to it, such as, deliberate doubt, unbelief, heresy, apostasy, and schism. Our leadership ministry activates all the resources of our faith community in a comprehensive integrated approach that is intentional. Our team is a privilege, responsibility and commitment, to one another and to the community.
