PASTOR’S REFLECTION

Next weekend, July 22 & 23rd Seton Parish will be hosting its annual Mission Appeal weekend. Every parish in the diocese welcomes a mission community into its parish once a year and an appeal is made for that community’s mission efforts worldwide. In this way, Seton Parish shares in the larger mission of the Church. This year we are welcoming the Pallottine Fathers and Brothers who are a religious community of over 2,300 members spread out over several countries over five continents. They were founded in Rome in 1835 by St. Vincent Pellotti. He is considered the pioneer in championing the role of the laity in the mission of the Church. He is recognized as having profoundly influenced the teaching of Vat. II on the laity. The mission of the Society is: “make everyone a Catholic, every Catholic a good Catholic, every good Catholic an Apostle.” He always reminded people that they are called to be apostles wherever they are and whatever they do. In India, the Pallottines run several missions aimed at catering to the needs of the poor and underprivileged. They run orphanages, as well as educational institutions. In addition, they undertake may social work programs directly aimed at helping the poor and needy. In traditional Catholic countries, they concentrate on the re-evangelization and training of the laity to become active apostles. We will hear more about them next week as we welcome Fr. Greg Serwa who will speak more about the Society’s work. There will be a second collection taken up for their mission work. I trust in your generosity in this once a year mission collection.

I am happy to announce that Deacon Greg Waybright is being reactivated again in his ministry as a deacon after several months off for healing and therapy from the stroke that he suffered. Bishop Campbell has asked that he reenter the ministry slowly and not to overdo it at first. We are happy to have him assisting us once again as he reacclimates himself in the parish. In the next month or two, his ministry assignment will become more defined. Please welcome him back when you see him.

July 16, 2017 – Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

THE FIRST COMMANDMENT: I AM THE LORD YOUR GOD, YOU SHALL NOT HAVE OTHER GODS BEFORE ME

445. What does God prohibit by his command, "You shall not have other gods before me" (Exodus 20:2)?

This commandment forbids:

- *Polytheism and idolatry*, which divinizes creatures, power, money, or even demons.
- *Superstition* which is a departure from the worship due to the true God and which also expresses itself in various forms of divination, magic, sorcery and spiritism.
- *Irreligion* which is evidenced: in tempting God by word or deed; in sacrilege, which profanes sacred persons or sacred things, above all the Eucharist; and in simony, which involves the buying or selling of spiritual things.
- *Atheism* which rejects the existence of God, founded often on a false conception of human autonomy.
- *Agnosticism* which affirms that nothing can be known about God, and involves indifferentism and practical atheism.
