**Pastor’s Reflection**

In the last few weeks, a lot of work has been done on our “punch list” of items that needed to be attended to as we try to tie up the renovation of the church. There are still a few items that need to be completed. The one area that we were unable to finish when the chapel was closed was the chapel floor. Beneath the carpeting the subfloor needs to be replaced and made absolutely level so that there is the elimination of all creaking when you walk on the floor. To accomplish this, the carpet should be removed. New carpeting is going to have go over this new floor. That new carpeting will be identical to what is in the chapel now and it is on order. When it arrives, a date will be set for this work to be done on the floor. That will take another day or two and the chapel will have to be closed once again. We will let you know when this will take place. All this work is under warranty and this problem with the flooring has been brought to my attention by many parishioners and I want to reassure our parishioners that it will be corrected properly.

On another related note, everyone who serves you here at Seton Parish does all that we can to be good stewards of our parish property and grounds. It is a lot to maintain and care for. We can be proud of its beauty that is taken care of both by paid and volunteers. There is always going to something in need of attention with a facility of this size. It also takes the care and attention of all our parishioners to treat all aspects of our parish facility with care and respect. As Pope Francis reminds us in his beautiful encyclical *Laudato Si, On Care for our Common Home: As Christians, we are called to accept the world as a sacrament of communion, as a way of sharing with God and our neighbor on a global scale. It is our humble conviction that the divine and human meet in the slightest detail in the seamless garment of God’s creation, in the last speck of dust of our planet.* #9

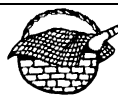
