Pastor's Reflection

God has blessed us with a beautiful weekend for our Parish Festival. I am so grateful in the name of the parish to our chairman Jason Heitmeyer and all of his chairs and all of our volunteers who have dedicated so much of their time and energy to make this weekend such an overwhelming success. I never tire of seeing everyone come together for the festivities here on this weekend year after year. It not only helps the parish financially, but it helps the parish and larger community socially as well. Every year I wonder how the Festival can reach new heights, but it always does. This year I am especially pleased that through everyone's generosity and participation, we are able to donate 25% of the proceeds of our Festival to those devastated by the recent hurricanes that have wracked our country. In these times, we feel so blessed that we are all able to assist our brothers and sisters in dire need. I am amazed at how many of us have friends and family in those placed affected by these natural disasters and so this touches us in a very personal way. In addition to our monetary offerings, we continue to offer our constant prayerful support to all who are working tirelessly to bring everyone back to their homes.

Next week, starting Sunday, Sept. 24th at 10pm, the Eucharistic chapel will be closed again for several days. The flooring beneath the carpeting needs to completely be reinstalled as well as the carpeting itself. If you walk in the chapel it creaks beneath you and it is not level. This will be corrected. This is under warranty. This is the last bit of work that needs to be done in the chapel. We have also been trying to get to the problem with the outside light of the Eucharistic chapel corrected as well. The installer has not been able to identify the problem but is addressing it, and this problem is under warranty as well. Finally, we have some issues with the control system with our new HVAC system that we are now getting to the bottom of that is being correctly assessed and addressed.
