**Pastor's Reflection**

Today at 1:30 p.m. we are having our annual St. Francis blessing of the pets at the St. Francis shrine located on the shores of Seton Pond. St. Francis has been a patron saint of our pets down through ages owing to his taming of the wolf that terrorized Assisi so long ago when he lived there. Our pets speak to us day in and day out of the goodness, beauty and blessing of all God's creation. We celebrate the feast of St. Francis this Weds. Oct. 4<sup>th</sup>. Our Holy Father Pope Francis in his encyclical letter, *Laudato Si*, says "that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us...Mother Earth who sustains and governs us and who produces various fruits with colored flowers and herbs."

Today we are having our 2<sup>nd</sup> collection for victims of Hurricane Irma in Florida and the Caribbean. Some have asked if there is going to be a collection for the victims of Hurricane Maria and the earthquake in Mexico. With these latest disasters occurring, the USCCB has informed the dioceses throughout the country that they are reviewing these situations and how best to respond. They have not called for additional special collections, but they have set up relief funds in order to accept donations. If you wish to make contributions for relief efforts to go toward Maria or the earthquake, please designate those on your checks or on a special envelope. The parish will then forward these funds to the Diocesan Finance Office and will make sure that the funds are properly transmitted to the USCCB for proper dispersal.
