Pastor's Reflection

Today we have a special insert in the bulletin of our year-end financial report for the fiscal year 2016-2017. If after reviewing this report, and you have any questions, the best person to seek the answers to your questions will be our business manager, Jim McQuaide who is here Monday-Friday during our normal working hours. He will be happy to answer any questions that you might have. I wish to thank all who have so generously contributed both to our parish offertory as well as to our capital fund drive, "A Home for Our Faith," which has allowed us to successfully complete the renovation of our church that was dedicated on the feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in January of 2017. As you review all of these figures, please realize that behind them stands all of the ministry that is going on in our parish three hundred and sixty-five days a year by both staff and parish volunteers. This ministry includes education, outreach, and support for the many kinds of ministries that the gospel calls us to live out. We can never say that the call and the mission that God gives us is complete.

One of the first things that you will notice when you review this report is that the numbers are indeed very tight when we compare income with expenses. As we neared the completion of the renovation of the church, there were any number of items that complimented its completion that needed its attention that we spent out of our regular parish income. This included items such as the landscaping for all the new building, some finishing touches in Herrmann Hall and the kitchen such as the floor. We have already upgraded the electronic front entrance on the new 256 entries, and a portion of the new concrete and asphalt was the parish expense as well. We also just recently purchased a new zero-turn lawn mower for the grounds. We have added security cameras for our entire complex both on the exterior as well as the interior. All this adds up to a significant figure. In the current fiscal year, we have addition expenses that we cannot ignore.

We are going to continue to make significant upgrades to our computer systems to handle the ever-increasing loads. The rectory is receiving all new replacement windows as many of the current windows have been leaking cold air for years. We hope to upgrade the restrooms and the hallway flooring. Finally, we realize that we need to improve the speakers that we have in the church. Most importantly, we will continue to move forward with our *Alpha* program in which it is my hope that every adult will take the opportunity to sign up for and participate in to renew your faith and growth in your relationship with Jesus Christ. This is our top priority in the parish.

As you review this report you will notice that our income has dropped in the past year. This corresponds with a report that I read in the Columbus Dispatch this past week that reports that our community lags in giving to charity and that the average in our area is 2.7% of one's income to charity. Remember, God asks for 10% - how are you doing?

Again, I thank you for your generosity and here at Seton Parish I can assure you that we will continue to be good stewards of what you entrust to us and we will continue to share as you generously share with us.

THE FOURTH COMMANDMENT: HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER

460. What are the duties of parents toward their children?

Parents, in virtue of their participation in the fatherhood of God, have the first responsibility for the education of their children and they are the first heralds of the faith for them. They have the duty to love and respect their children as *persons* and as *children of God* and to provide, as far as is possible, for their physical and spiritual needs. They should select for them a suitable school and help them with prudent counsel in the choice of their profession and their state of life. In particular they have the mission of educating their children in the Christian faith.
