

Pastor's Reflection

The month of October is traditionally Respect Life Month. In recent weeks, we have seen firsthand how fragile life is with the assault of wildfires, hurricanes and earthquakes in different parts of North America. Life is indeed precious. When our lives are under attack, we need to remember the words from the prophet Isaiah: *Do not fear, I am with you.* This year the theme of Respect Life is "Be Not Afraid." Our God is not a detached observer to our pain. Rather our God became one with us and experienced immense suffering for you and me. There may be times when we doubt the value of our own lives due to the suffering that we are experiencing. But we can see that even in the midst of our most difficult trials, this can be the place where God manifests his victory and makes all things new. We cannot lose sight that Jesus is always with us. As followers of Jesus we not only take refuge in Jesus, but we are invited to reach out to one another, especially the weak and vulnerable to do the same. Building a culture of life is not something we do just one week or one month during the year. We are all engaged in it day in and day out as we care for our aging parents who are in failing health. Or when a friend becomes pregnant in difficult circumstances and we support her and help her welcome the life of her little one. Sometimes we may not know exactly what to do, but let us not let the fear of doing the wrong thing keep us from living out our missionary call. We do not have to have everything always figured out. Remember the guidance of our Blessed Virgin Mary: *Do whatever he tells you.* During this Respect Life Month let us help one another continue to embrace the life that God has gifted us with. Whatever storms we face, we are not alone. Remember the words of Jesus: *Behold I am with you always until the end of the age* (Matt. 28:20).

Be Not Afraid October Respect Life Month

Be Not Afraid is the theme of this year's Respect Life Month which we celebrate every October to honor God's good and perfect gift of Human Life. There are many events being planned throughout the diocese and in our parish. One very special event we will be participating in is the 40 Days for Life (40DFL) program. 40DFL is a coordinated, national campaign to bring continuous prayer to local abortion clinics in more than 570 cities across the world. This fall, the vigil will be held at the Founders' Women's Clinic at 1243 E. Broad Street. The 40 Days will be from September 27 through November 5. THE FOURTH COMMANDMENT: HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER
