MASS OF REMEMBRANCE

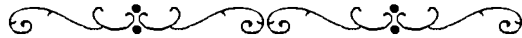

Pastor's Reflection

Wednesday is Nov. 1st and the Feast of All Saints, a Holy Day of obligation. It is a feast that dates to the earliest centuries of the life of the church and by the seventh century, it was kept everywhere as a public holyday. In the early centuries, the feast was kept in May, but later it was transferred to November for the simple reason that it was easier to feed all the pilgrims that flocked to Rome at the end of the harvest. From the earliest days of the church, it was realized that all the martyrs and other saints who lead exemplary lives could not be accorded the honor the honor of a special individual celebration on a single day. There simply were not enough days in the year. Secondly, it was felt that on this one day, honor could be properly rendered in one grand celebration to all the saints. And so, we continue what the Church has been celebrating for centuries, both known and unknown who now enjoy the glory of heaven. As we join in this celebration, we strive ourselves to be numbered one day amongst the saints in heaven.

Next Sunday after all the Masses, we will be holding our Ministry Market Place in Herrmann Hall. Here all the ministries of Seton Parish will be showcased, and you will have the opportunity to see them all in one setting and to consider which of them you may wish to offer your time and talent. THE FOURTH COMMANDMENT: HONOR YOUR FATHER AND YOUR MOTHER

464. What are the duties of citizens in regard to civil authorities?

Those subject to authority should regard those in authority as representatives of God and offer their loyal collaboration for the right functioning of public and social life. This collaboration includes love and service of one's homeland, the right and duty to vote, payment of taxes, the defense of one's country, and the right to exercise constructive criticism.

465. When is a citizen forbidden to obey civil authorities?
