As the calendar turned this week to the month of November along with the changing of our clocks, we are definitely aware of the changing of the seasons. As the seasons change, so too our liturgical season begins to shift and we start to focus on the end of time as well. The whole months of November, the church remembers and honors our deceased loved ones. Today I will be leading the prayers for our deceased on this Cemetery Sunday at Holy Cross Cemetery at 2:00 p.m. out in Pataskala. Tomorrow evening, Nov. 6<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. we have our annual Mass of Remembrance where we remember all our deceased loved ones who have gone on to their eternal dwelling in heaven in the past year. The whole month of November is a time to remember in our prayers and in our hearts, those whom we have so richly shared their life with us. This is also a time for us to proclaim the mystery of our faith in the Communion of Saints. Our loved ones not only live in that inexhaustible life which is beyond our present knowledge and our living faith assures us that we are in communion with them. What a rich month and time this is in the life of our church. It fills us with much hope in the midst of our losses.

Next weekend after 5:00, 8:00, and 9:30 Masses, we will be offering the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. ### Catechism Corner

Sponsored by the Spiritual Life Commission

November 5, 2017 – Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT: YOU SHALL NOT KILL

##### 466. Why must human life be respected?

Human life must be respected because it is *sacred*. From its beginning human life involves the creative action of God and it remains forever in a special relationship with the Creator, who is its sole end. It is not lawful for anyone directly to destroy an innocent human being. This is gravely contrary to the dignity of the person and the holiness of the Creator. “Do not slay the innocent and the righteous” (*Exodus 23:7*).

##### 467. Why is the legitimate defense of persons and of society not opposed to this norm?

Because in choosing to legitimately defend oneself one is respecting the right to life (either one’s own right to life or that of another) and not choosing to kill. Indeed, for someone responsible for the life of another, legitimate defense can be not only a right but a grave duty, provided only that disproportionate force is not used.
