Pastor's Reflection

Thursday, we celebrate Thanksgiving Day. We have the beautiful tradition here of having a festive morning Mass at 9:00 a.m. with our choir. It has been our tradition to bring non-perishable food items as our offerings at this Mass that will be used toward our Portsmouth food outreach that begins this weekend. This is a wonderful way to begin this beautiful day that God gifts us with to give thanks for the blessings that fill our lives. As we recognize the source of our gifts this day, we can be assured that God will continue to grace our lives with His love. May we have a blessed holiday sharing God's love with family and friends in the days ahead.

Today we kick-off our annual Portsmouth food drive for families in need in Scioto County. The need is roughly the same each year as we strive to create 750 food baskets for families in need in Scioto County. The families that we serve are identified through Catholic Social Services in Portsmouth. We provide non-perishable goods as well as fresh produce and fresh hams for their Christmas Food Baskets. From Seton Parishioners, we need you to pick-up the food slips as well as envelopes for monetary offerings which purchases the fresh produce as well as the hams. Your donations also helps to fund our youth for the transportation down to Portsmouth for the weekend, and the trucks to transport all the food as well. This is our parish's major Christmas project and so we look for the support of everyone who calls themselves a member of Seton Parish.

This weekend and next, we are having the annual collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). This is being held in conjunction with the First World Day of the Poor instituted by Pope Francis. In his statement establishing this day, Pope Francis said to mark this occasion *with moments of encounter and friendship, solidarity and concrete assistance with people living in poverty*. This is exactly what the CCHD accomplishes. Nearly 41 million people live in poverty in the United States. This campaign is not a hand out program, rather it is meant to break the circle of poverty. Many of its projects embody the Corporal Words of Mercy, expand access to healthcare, and work at the protection of worker rights. This is the official anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic bishops. Finally, 25% of all funds collected stay right in our own diocese to support local anti-poverty programs. This is one of the most important 2nd collections of the year that I personally support.

This Tuesday at 7:00 p.m. there will be an ecumenical Community Thanksgiving Service at Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church, 8950 Refugee Rd. sponsored by the Pickerington Ministerial Association. The offering taken at this service is non-perishable food items for the Pickerington Food Pantry or monetary offering for the pantry as well. I have been attending this service for years as our many areas churches have hosted it, and I encourage your participation. It is always good to thank the Lord for our many blessings with all of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Catechism Corner

November 19, 2017 – Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

THE FIFTH COMMANDMENT: YOU SHALL NOT KILL 470. What is forbidden by the fifth commandment?

The fifth commandment forbids as gravely contrary to the moral law:

- *direct and intentional murder* and cooperation in it;
- *direct abortion*, willed as an end or as means, as well as cooperation in it. Attached to this sin is the penalty of excommunication because, from the moment of his or her conception, the human being must be absolutely respected and protected in his integrity;
- *direct euthanasia* which consists in putting an end to the life of the handicapped, the sick, or those near death by an act or by the omission of a required action;
- *suicide* and voluntary cooperation in it, insofar as it is a grave offense against the just love of God, of self, and of neighbor. One's responsibility may be aggravated by the scandal given; one who is psychologically disturbed or is experiencing grave fear may have diminished responsibility.
