**Pastor's Reflection**

Next weekend, Dec. 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> all across the United States the annual collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious will be taken which benefits nearly 33,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers and religious order priests whose religious communities lack adequate retirement funding. While Catholics have been overwhelming generous for the past 29 years since the collection has started, still only 8% of religious communities are adequately funded for retirement. As I am sure you are aware, in years past when religious men and women served the church, they did it for a pittance, and now these same communities do not have adequate savings for their members, especially in light of rising health care costs. Escalating the problem is the declining number of religious who are serving in these communities today to help contribute to their elderly members. And so it is a problem that the whole church faces. I know that I can trust in your generosity because I am quite certain that many of you and your families have benefited from the generosity of religious men and women over the past generations that have built our church today.

This weekend at the 11:15 Mass, we are celebrating the Rite of Welcoming of our new Catechumens and Candidates into our church. In this rite, they express their intention to follow and come to know Christ more fully in their lives. We as a parish, promise to share and witness the gospel more fully with them so that they can embrace it fully and be initiated into our Church at Easter. As they go forward from this day, they will be dismissed after the homily and they will continue to break open God's Word which will continue to feed them until they share more fully with us at the table of the Lord. Please continue to hold them in your prayers that the seed of faith that has been planted in their hearts may continue to grow and mature in the months ahead.

#### PORTSMOUTH OUTREACH

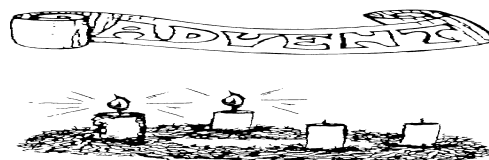
